Young People and Domestic Abuse / Peer on Peer Abuse Traffic Light Tool

Section 47 investigations should be initiated for all under 16s if red factors present – either victim or young person causing harm (and over 16s where necessary). Whole family assessment should follow where possible and all over 16s should be DASH risk assessed. Remember to consider the ages of the young people involved re. legal age of sexual consent.
